Hours and Booking

King Street Pre-school meets every weekday in term time from 9:15am until 12:15pm. In the event of late collection (10 mins), a late fee of £5 per five minutes will be applied.

As we are registered childcare provider, children ages three and four are eligible for free early years education which includes five, three-hour sessions per week. The Pre-school Leader will inform you when your child is eligible for this funding.

To book a place for your child, please complete the registration form and return it to Dana Sajfrtova, Pre-school Leader. Please note that half a term’s notice is required in the event that you need to cancel your child’s place.

King Street Pre-school was established in January 2006 to provide the local community with a stimulating and happy environment for early years children.

Housed in a purpose-built setting adjoining Wesley Methodist Church, King Street Pre-school is a not-for-profit organisation, run by a committee of current and past parents and carers. As a small school we pride ourselves on offering a caring atmosphere, which allows your child to feel secure without being over-awed by the scale of a new environment.

Curriculum and Activities

King Street Pre-school aims to provide excellent care and a wide range of learning opportunities which help develop the social, emotional and cognitive skills of every child.

As such, we offer a wide variety of stimulating free play activities, both indoor and outdoor. From painting and art, to role-playing and construction, children develop their ability to choose and complete tasks while exploring and experimenting. In addition, several adult-led group activities provide the children with new experiences and skills while encouraging them to work with others.

From time to time, we also have visits from members of the community where children can learn about wildlife, recycling and health. We also have visits from parents who share special skills such as languages and art.
